Alamgir Welfare Trust Int'l second team started relief activities in Sindh by distributing relief goods worth Rs. 15 Lac. More supplies are being sent.

Karachi: After Khyber PK, Alamgir Welfare Trust Int'l starts relief activities in severely affected areas of sindh.

Spokesman Alamgir Trust, Mr. Shakeel Dehelvi told that a team comprising 10 members is busy in Kand Koat, Karampur and Ghous pur, Sindh providing relief goods. The team, headed by General Manager Mr. Shafi Bedani has distributed food packets, coolers, cloths, quilts and other item worth Rupes 1.5 million to the victims of the devastating flood in Sindh.

The Relief team has made Sukkar its base camp from where the relief aid is extended to Kandcoat, Ghouspur, Karampur and other adjacent villages.
